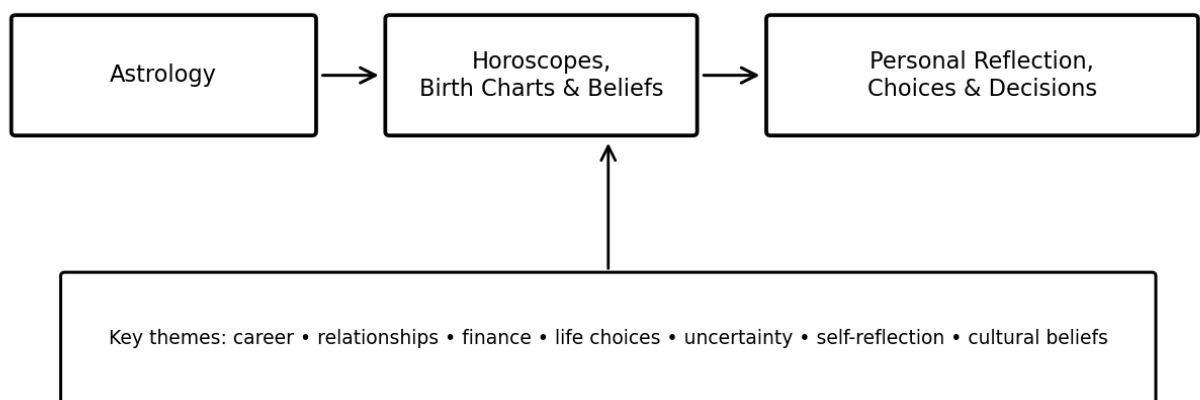


Figure 1. Conceptual framework showing the influence of astrology on personal decision-making.
